THE VANAGON HAS NOW BECOME A "MOVING" VAN.

Everyone who drives the Vanagon for the first time is absolutely stunned by its performance. The reason for this moving experience is the new 1.9 liter Water Boxer engine.

It's a full 22% more powerful than the engine it replaced. It's even smarter. It has a unique Digi-Jet fuel-injection system that monitors the fuel and air mixture for maximum output.

If you're looking for the Water Boxer, don't look in the front of the Vanagon. It's in the rear, where an engine belongs in a van — right over the rear axle for maximum traction.

This arrangement helps keep engine noise low. Provides more passenger room. And distributes front-to-rear weight almost equally.

Of course, the ultimate test of any engine is its road performance. And here other vans must take a back seat to the Vanagon.

The Water Boxer, coupled with a 4-speed manual transmission, provides outstanding mid-range acceleration at the speeds you use most frequently.

The Vanagon also sports both rack-and-pinion steering

and 4-wheel independent suspension. Its handling and responsiveness is more akin to a sedan than to a van.

But don't think you have to find tricky S-curves to enjoy the Vanagon's impressive road manners. It's just as much at home in the city maneuvering effortlessly in and out of traffic and tight parking spaces.

The Vanagon is another example of Volkswagen ingenuity. You gain the power and performance of a sedan without losing any of the carrying capacity or versatility of a van.

When you first see the Vanagon GL, you'll be surprised at how compact and streamlined it really is.

But inside, it's absolutely spacious.

The Vanagon GL is also extremely versatile. It can carry seven people in great comfort. Or nearly a ton of cargo in its 200 cubic feet of interior space. To accomplish this, simply remove the middle seat, and fold down the rear one.

But don't think that because the Vanagon GL can be such a

workhorse that it's boring and stark. In fact, its interior is richly appointed. The fit and finish is virtually flawless. Standard comfort and convenience features abound, like contoured front bucket seats with velour upholstery and fold-down arm rests. Tinted glass. Plus a rear window de-fogger, intermittent wipers and quartz clock, also standard on the Vanagon.

When the weather turns cold, your passengers will appreciate the front and rear

heater system with flow-through ventilation and 3-speed blowers.

And when you turn the key on, you'll appreciate the reliability of the breakerless electronic ignition.

As you can see, the Vanagon GL is a fully equipped van with very little to add. In fact, all you can add is automatic transmission, radio, sunroof, air conditioning and metallic paint.

Since people who own Vanagons spend a lot of time in them, Volkswagen has put a lot of thought into how to make

them as pleasant as possible. The Vanagon's wall-to-wall picture windows, for example, make even a short trip a sightseeing adventure. Sliding windows add to the Vanagon's flow-through air circulation to make it even more comfortable. And a lockable glove box eliminates one more travel worry.

It had to be conceived by both a German engineer and lover of the great outdoors.

The German engineer endowed the Vanagon Camper with superb traction and handling to make sure you enjoy the ride to the camping grounds.

The lover of great outdoors turned it into a home-away-

from-home to make sure you enjoy your stay.

The first thing you'll notice on the Camper is its unique pop-top. This raises the roof enough so that even six-footers can stand tall. A skylight lets the daylight and moonlight in. And protective mosquito netting keeps the bugs out.

The bench seat folds down into a double bed. With the

pop-top up, another double bunk is revealed. These double beds provide comfortable sleeping quarters for four. And when meal time rolls around the area serves as a dining room, complete with kitchenette. Both front bucket seats swivel around to face swing-out tables for gracious dining.

Extra storage space for food and clothing is found in every

corner. Other homey touches are sliding windows and screens, plus two 110 Volt outlets for small appliances, like a TV.

So if you enjoy cross country travelling, or occasionally just sleeping out under the stars, get behind the wheel of a Vanagon Camper.

You'll feel right at home.

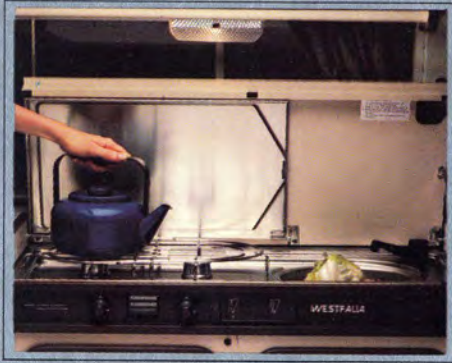


AN OPEN HOUSE TOUR OF THE VANAGON CAMPER.

A quick walk inside the Vanagon Camper will acquaint you with all its major household facilities.

In the kitchenette you'll find the 2-burner LP gas stove with the light above it. Next to it is a sink supplied by a 10.5 gallon tank. Both are covered by a heat resistant counter top.

A curtained sliding window ventilates the area. Both front bucket seats can swivel around to use the swing-out dining tables.



A gas/electric refrigerator and food cupboard hold a healthy supply of food.

The bench seat folds down to form one double bed, while the pop-top hides another.

Storage compartments are located throughout the Camper:

A small cupboard next to the refrigerator.

An extra space for bedding under the seat.

A clothes locker with mirrored door.

An overhead all-purpose cabinet.

A 3-drawer closet that holds clothes.

And to show that Volkswagen believes in the quality and durability of these facilities, a limited warranty covers both the Camper and the equipment.

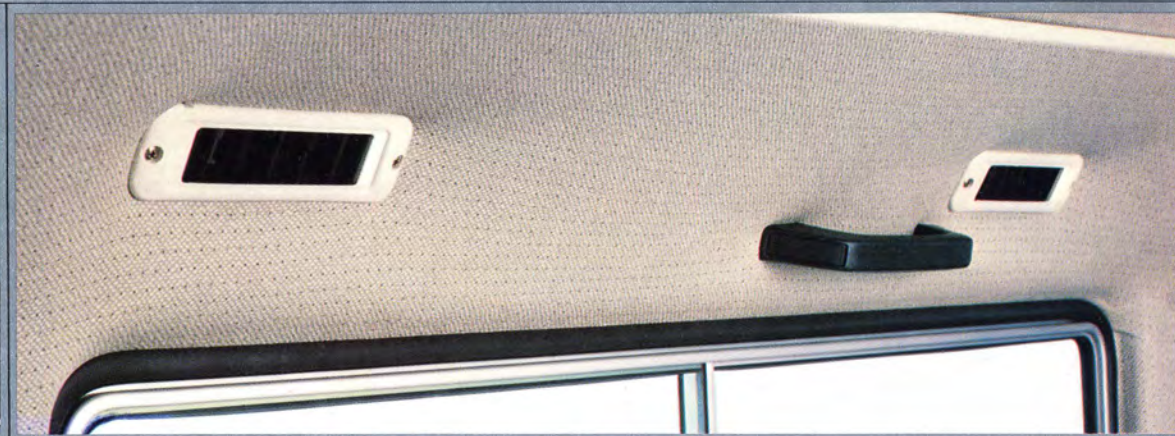

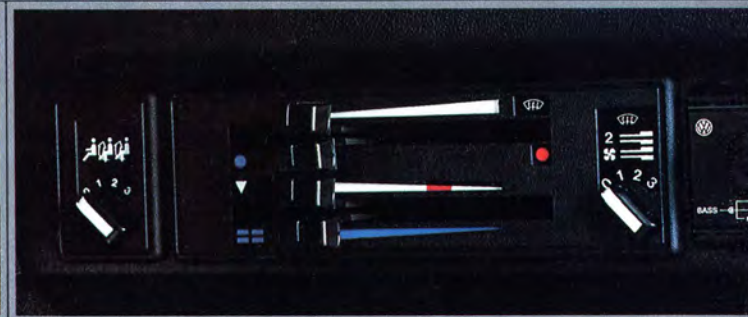

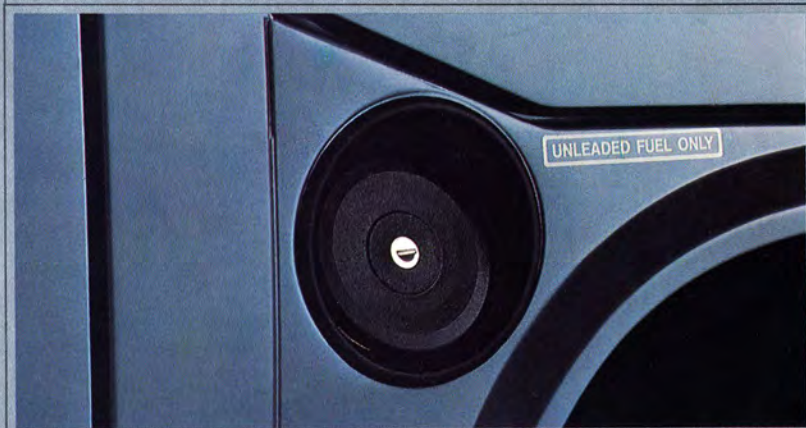
Overhead fresh-air outlets.

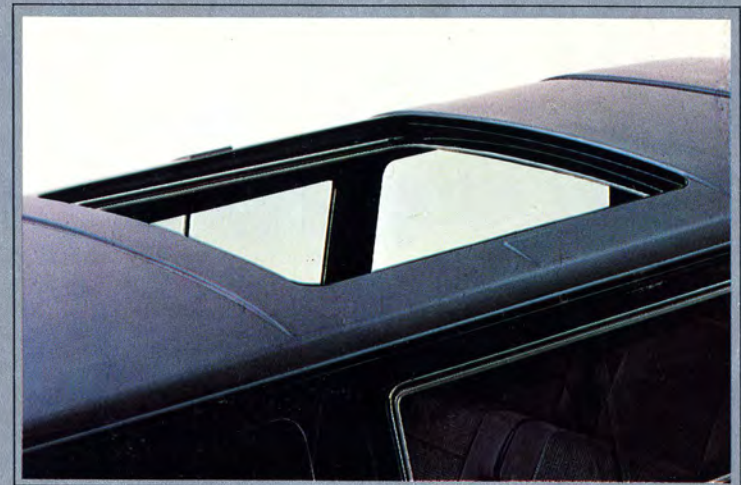

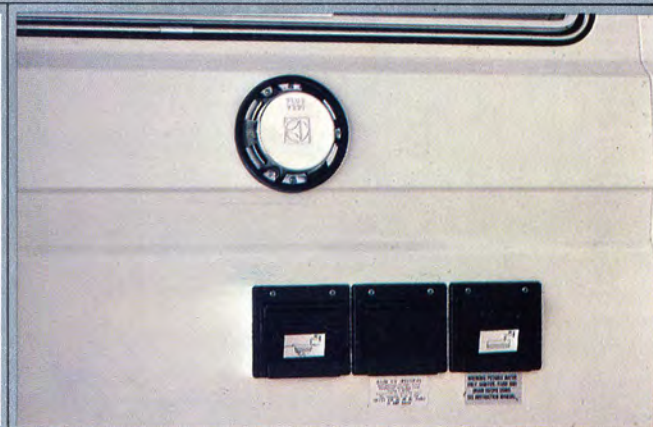
